

AO CELEBRATES PHASE II GRAND OPENING OF MOUNTAIN VIEW VILLAGE IN RIVERTON, UT



Phase II of the Premier Mixed-Use Lifestyle Destination Brings a Downtown Vibe to the New City Center; Features the Largest Architectural Micro-LED Embedded Glass Installation in the U.S.

Orange, CA - June 30, 2022 – Mountain View Village, a new mixed-use open-air lifestyle development in Riverton, UT is celebrating the completion of its second phase of development with a four-day community party culminating on the 4th of July. <u>AO</u>, a leading full-service architecture firm with design expertise spanning the full commercial real estate spectrum, served as the design architect, architect of record, landscape and interior architect for the mixed-use entertainment center. CenterCal Properties is the developer.

Nestled in the South Valley, Mountain View Village sits 30 miles south of Salt Lake City, in the fastest growing submarket in the United States. AO's masterplan thoughtfully designed the almost 1 million square foot center to include all of the benefits of a downtown, offering shopping, dining, office space and recreation to visitors and residents of the quickly developing neighborhoods nearby. When completed, the 85-acre mixed-use lifestyle destination will feature more than 30 dining options, a 14-screen Cinemark Theater complex, 177,000 square feet of Class A office space, and diverse shopping options including health, beauty and apparel boutiques, home furnishings and electronics.

Managing Partner Rob Budetti. "Our goal was to design and plan a concept that replicated a downtown feel with a sense that the buildings were developed over time to keep the space authentic and engaging – a downtown area with a modern-day appeal."

The village center includes a plaza with a state-of-the-art fountain near an airy, glass-walled covered pavilion highlighting the local food scene with indoor and outdoor dining. The open space serves as an intimate gathering spot with diverse entertainment, lounge, and action zones for all ages. The public lawn features spaces for games and a children's play area which includes a slide and apparatus mimicking the colors and shape of a biplane – a tribute to CenterCal's founder, Fred Bruning. AO's design and landscape studios also incorporated a built-in stadium-stair area with a communal firepit fixture to encourage visitors to relax and enjoy this special gathering space, all of which surrounds a dramatic, three-story architectural micro-LED glass display. The largest in the United States, the 38-foot-wide, 42-foot-tall G-Glass display projects images and videos from a micro-LED embedded glass building material, adding a unique attraction for this experience-driven entertainment and shopping destination.

"AO has been a phenomenal partner. They created the original vision and saw us through construction drawings to completion. We couldn't be more thrilled with the Grand Opening we celebrate today with their fine work," President, Intermountain Region, CenterCal Properties Craig Trottier shared.

AO designed the buildings of Mountain View Village to look both old and new, creating the genuine experience of a well-preserved, classic American town center. Building facades reminiscent of a city hall, firehouse, and library complement the central lawn, and LED light show fountain. The lush landscape includes thousands of plants and 1,700 new trees throughout the property. Showcasing the local culture and celebrating American heritage, a curated public arts program will be unveiled during the grand opening. Following the first art piece, a bronze sculpture titled "Majestic" which features a 10-foot-tall eagle in phase one of Mountain View Village, phase two will include three new patriotic sculptures. Each designed by artist Brian Keith, the artwork includes a revolutionary Minuteman, Betsy Ross sewing the American flag, and a young boy with his grandfather, hands over hearts.

"We took design inspiration from the state of Utah, and more specifically Salt Lake City architecture – incorporating thick brick facades that respond to the natural materials and create a sense of place within this modern agrarian city. It's a special place and we are proud to bring the collective vision of CenterCal and the community to life." said Budetti.
